...and still not know what was going on.

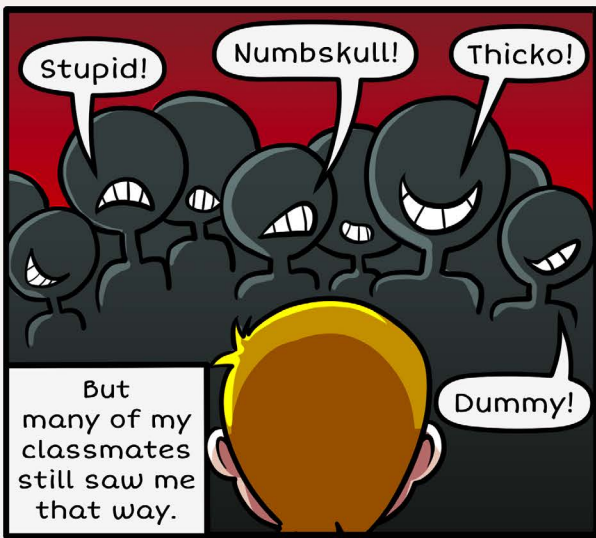
Trying to understand what I was reading was like having to break through a thick sheet of ice in order to get through to the juicy story or facts inside.

welllllll... you can imagine how I did.

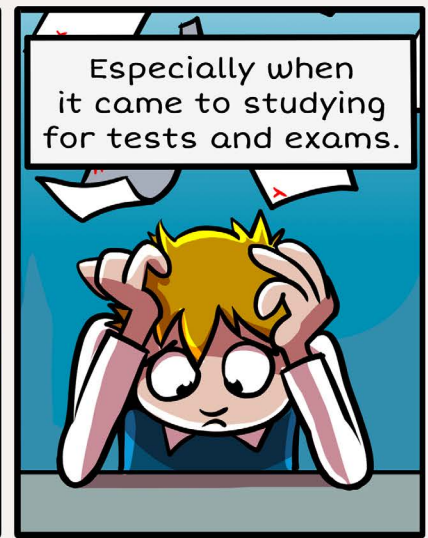
When I was 11, I was diagnosed with dyslexia. This was a relief, because I found out my difficulties weren't a matter of me being stupid!
